

### In Memoriam



Brother Plez Avery Transou, 90, a recipient of the Grand Lodge 65-Year Service Award, laid down the working tools of life on Saturday, 25 March 2017, in Dallas.

Brother Transou was born 29 May 1926 at Winston-Salem, NC, the only child of Plez Alexander Transou and Hattie Farrington Transou. He graduated from R. J. Reynolds High School in 1943. After a year at Georgia Tech University, he joined the U.S. Navy and served on the Destroyer Minesweeper #41, the USS Doran, in the Pacific during World War II. After the war, he attended and graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. After graduation, he began a 39-year professional career in the furniture business, and became the Sales and Marketing Director for the Myrtle Desk Company in the Texas, Oklahoma and New Mexico territories. He moved from North Carolina to Dallas in 1955, where he married Diane Parkins of Dallas.

Brother Transou was initiated, passed and raised in 1950 in West Bend Lodge No. 434, Lewisville, NC. He affiliated with Dallas Lodge No. 760 in 1970 and was Worshipful Master of that lodge in 1976-77. He was a Past Master of Claud L. Austin Lodge No. 1450, serving as the lodge's Secretary from 1987 to 2005, and was a Charter Member of St. Alban's Lodge No. 1455. In the Grand Lodge of Texas, he served as District Deputy Grand Master of District 14-A in 1980 and as Grand Senior Deacon in 1987. In 2003, he was awarded the Golden Trowel Award by Dallas Lodge No. 760. In 2004, he was awarded the John Sayles Award for his lifelong contributions to Freemasonry.

An internationally recognized Masonic scholar and author, he was a Charter member of Texas Lodge of Research, and was elected the lodge's twentieth Worshipful Master, serving from 1979 to 1980. He was the author of the book, Masonic Almanacs and Anti-Masonic Almanacs, published in 1982 by The Masonic Book Club. In 1989, he was elected Secretary of Texas Lodge of Research, serving in that office for fifteen years. He was elected the lodge's tenth Fellow in Masonic Research in 1989. In 1991, he was elected Secretary of the newly created Scottish Rite Research Society, and served in that office for ten years, when he was named the Society's "Founding Secretary Emeritus."

Brother Transou was principally responsible for the donation of the Masonic library of Past Grand Master Robert L. Dillard, Jr., by the Dallas Scottish Rite to the Brazos Valley Masonic Library & Museum at College Station.

Among his many affiliations, Brother Transou was a member of the DeMolay Legion of Honor; York Rite of Freemasonry; the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry; St. Mark's Conclave of the Red Cross of Constantine; the Grand College of Rites, U.S.A.; the National Sojourners; and The Order of the Foul [sic] (a special organization that Plez created many years ago, and which he conferred on select friends).

Brother Transou was a Thirty-third Degree Scottish Rite Mason, and was elected General Secretary of the Dallas Scottish Rite in 1989, serving in that office for over thirteen years. He also served for many years as an Advisory Trustee of the Scottish Rite Hospital for Children.

#### H. David Moore



Treasurer Moore has been a Master Mason for 57 years, receiving his degrees in East Gate Lodge No. 543 in Tulsa, Oklahoma, in June 1960. He affiliated with Plano Lodge No. 768 in 1979, where he

served as Worshipful Master in 1989-90, and for the past six years has served as the Plano Lodge Secretary.

He is an active York Rite Mason and served as Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Texas in 2012-2013.

David's research paper, entitled "Masonry in Plano", was presented in Richardson Lodge on 16 March 1996, where he was elected a Full Member of the Texas Lodge of Research.

# Joe C. Harrison 2017 Anson Jones Lecturer



Joseph Curtis Harrison was born in Memphis and reared in Paris, TN. He owns degrees in Electronic Engineering Technology, Psychology, Business Administration, and Management Information Systems. He is currently is an Associate Professor of Information Systems at Union University in Jackson, TN.

Most Worshipful Harrison was raised a Master Mason in September 1983 in Bartlett Lodge No. 211 and served as Worshipful Master in 1990. In 1999, he was elected Junior Grand Warden and progressed to serve as Grand Master of Tennessee in 2002. In February 2002, he was elected to the Commission in Recognition of the Conference of Grand Masters of North America. He served as Chairman of the Commission for three years and currently serves as Secretary/Treasurer. PGM Harrison received the Masonic Medal of Honor from the Grand Lodge of Bulgaria in 2008 for his work in unifying Masonry in that country.

Brother Harrison is a 33° Scottish Rite Mason, receiving the degrees in Memphis Consistory. He was President of the Scottish Rite Foundation (Childhood Language Disorders Clinic) in 2007-2008. In 2007, Brother Harrison became Chairman of the Board and Personal Representative of the SGIG in the Memphis Scottish Rite and was elected Sovereign Grand Inspector General in 2015.

He is a Past Sovereign of St. Stephens Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine, and became the Intendent General of Tennessee. He has served as Grand Almoner of the United Grand Imperial Council, Red Cross of Constantine, and is presently Grand Viceroy.

Companion Harrison has served as High Priest of Millington Chapter No. 225, Illustrious Master of Millington Council No. 131, and Eminent Commander of Millington Commandery No. 39, where he was made a Knight Crusader of the Cross. He has been Governor of the York Rite College and received the Order of the Purple Cross from the York Rite Sovereign College. Companion Harrison was elected to receive the Knight of York Cross of Honor and the Grand Cross of Honor. He served as General Grand Prelate of the Convent General KYCH in 2006 and 2012.

He is a member of many other appendant bodies, including Al Chymia Shrine Temple, Grand College of Rites, Royal Order of Scotland, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, Allied Masonic Degrees, Knight Masons, Tall Cedars of Lebanon, National Sojourners and Heroes of '76, Order of the Eastern Star, SRICF, Rectified Scottish Rite CBCS, St. Thomas of Acon, and Mayflower Conclave Pilgrim Preceptors, in many of which he served as presiding officer. Brother Harrison is a member of the Tennessee Lodge of Research.

Senior Warden Livingston is a Past Master of Richardson Masonic Lodge No. 1214 and the current Worshipful Master of Hillcrest Masonic Lodge No. 1318. His current Masonic activities include

service as an officer of the 14<sup>th</sup> Districts MWSA, the Dallas Scottish Rite, and several appendant bodies. He also actively serves in leadership roles at First United Methodist Church Richardson. His research paper discussed the legal meaning of "moral turpitude."

Professionally, Chris is Senior Assistant City Attorney with the City of Garland. He is a graduate of the University of Texas School of Law and the University of Kansas. He and his wife Ashley are raising two boys in Dallas.

The Committee on Masonic Education & Service for the Grand Lodge of Texas is responsible for providing resources that will help the Masons of Texas gain a deeper and more meaningful understanding of the History, Jurisprudence, Philosophy, Ritual, and Symbolism of Freemasonry. In an effort to fulfill its obligation, the committee has completed several projects and begun a series of initiatives it believes will help further the cause of Masonic education in Texas

Past Grand Master Leonard P. Harvey's book, *Masonry and the Mason*, an excellent resource for the newly raised Master Mason, and the A.L.L. program have both been updated and are now available through the Grand Lodge. *Sharing Freemasonry*, originally introduced by Past Grand Master Jerry L. Martin as an aid to Lodge Mentors, has been updated and will be going to the printer later this month.

The 2017 Briscoe Fall Workshop Program is complete and presentations in your District will begin in mid-September. This year's program includes situations related to the application of Grand Lodge Law as well as discussions of topics on Masonic Symbolism and Philosophy. The 2017 Officer Leadership Program (formerly the Wardens' Retreat), designed to prepare those who have been selected to lead their Lodges to do so effectively and efficiently, will begin the first weekend in August. Please see the Grand Lodge website for dates, locations, and registration information. Registration is open to all Master Masons.

Among the initiatives that we are working on are an update and rewrite of the L.I.F.E. Program, creating an MESC website to facilitate distribution of materials, and a Title V Handbook for Lodges. Lastly, in conjunction with members of TLR, the committee has completed an educational program entitled "Brotherhood of Light," which should be available online prior to year's end.

As a member of TLR and someone interested in Masonic Education, I am confident you will find something of value in these offerings and ask your assistance by helping us promote them within your Lodges.
